from my faculty advisor about the classes I had to complete in my Respiratory Care curriculum both at OLHCC and in the Ochsner program. In my prerequisite classes taken at the college, I was given the basic tools and knowledge to allow me to be successful in the clinical phase of the program. During my semesters of clinical study, I was able to learn and deal with patients directly which gave me a true feel of the work and responsibility of a Respiratory Therapist.

After finishing my degree requirements in December of 2001, I had a smooth transition into the workforce. I did not have to worry about making a resume and going on interviews like the other graduating seniors. I already had an established job and good relationships with the other therapists and hospital staff I would be working with in my field. At the present time, I am expected to work twelve hour shifts and on some weekends and holidays at the hospital, but I enjoy having days off during the week to do some extracurricular activities. And when I do work on holidays, weekends, or pick up an occasional night shift, I am paid nice differentials as an incentive.

As a Respiratory Therapist, I provide hands-on care that helps people recover from a wide range of medical conditions. Respiratory therapists are found working in intensive care units managing ventilators, in emergency rooms, newborn and pediatric units, home care, and sleep laboratories. Respiratory Care professionals can also work in management, education, and air transport programs. Some therapists have established home care and diagnostic companies.

I feel that the most rewarding aspect of being a Respiratory Therapist is seeing the smiles on patients' faces when they are feeling better, the gratitude shown by their family members, and just knowing that I am making a great difference in the local community as well as the community as a whole.
